March 7, 2023-Refreshments and Job Hazard Analysis

The Meeting was attended by:

Speaker: Bob Drane, MS, CSP, OSHS

Bob presented on Job Hazard Analysis. Some good takeaways, among many others, included:

- Common hazards to be avoided that can be encountered when performing work
- Hazard mitigation approaches with reference to the Hierarchy of Controls
- Some takeaways in the process to complete the JHA:
 - o Prioritize the job to evaluate based on relevance and hazard
 - List all steps of the job
 - Document each step
 - Evaluate each step (using 5Ws as example)
 - Discuss steps with people who do the work and involve the supervisors in completing the analysis
 - Collaborate with others who may be able to provide insights
 - Develop an actionable control for each hazard
- Formalize the process with forms to facilitate the analysis (Example: https://www.liberty.edu/security-public-safety/wp-content/uploads/sites/101/2022/09/JHA-Template-0922.pdf)
